And therefore religion raises so many shadows and seeming contradictions. And it is for want of distinguishing ... the meaning of words in divinity from what is intended by them in their ordinary use that arise most of the jangles about religion in the world.
And to one who is not much for elevated thought, many things that are in themselves as easy and natural as the things we every day converse with, seem like impossibility and confusion. ..."

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
